

# COLD WEATHER Campout Gear Checklist

## Essential Personal Gear to remember

- Your Class "A" Uniform. Show up wearing it Friday Night.
- Cup, bowl and plate
- Fork, knife and spoon
- Small light weight flashlight with fresh batteries
- Compass
- Warm shoes. Show up wearing them Friday night.
- Pocket knife (if you have your Toting Chit)
- Rain gear
- Personal cleanup items like soap, toothbrush, & toothpaste
- Canteen or water bottle filled with water
- Warm winter coat
- Layers of day time clothes that will fit under your jacket. Examples include sweatshirts, undershirts, etc
- Gloves or mittens
- Warm hat to wear during the day
- Complete extra set of dry clean clothes

## Essential Clothes/Gear to SLEEP in

- Sleeping bag
- Extra blanket(s) based on temperature-rating of your sleeping bag  
2 blankets if you have a summer 30° bag, 1 blanket with a 10 - 20° degree bag
- Foam pad, ThermoRest or extra blanket to go under your sleeping bag
- Clean dry underwear (Change each night)
- Clean dry sweat shirt & sweat pants (Do not wear during daytime)
- Clean dry socks (Change each night)
- Clean dry ski type pullover hat (Do not wear during daytime)

**Sleeping clothes are separate than daytime clothes.  
The above just accounts for your nighttime clothes.**

## Tent Gear

- A Scout buddy or your Dad. No Scout should cold weather tent camp alone.
- A 2 or 3 person Troop tent. (Personal tents must be shown and approved for use by the Scoutmaster)  
*A extra large tent does not keep you warm. You are heating extra high up air that never gets close to you.*
- 5' x 7' piece of plastic to put INSIDE your tent. *Do not use an aluminum lined space blanket in the winter, it conducts cold.*
- A plastic ground cloth UNDER your tent. If you are using a Troop tent you should have this.
